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1. INTRODUCTION

There is long felt need for properly motivated and adequately equipped professionals for social work in various fields . The MSW course of the university of Pune is an attempt for education by relating it to needs of social welfare with changing needs. of the social surrounding in Urban, Rural and Tribal Sector , It is an effort to meet the ever increasing demand for creating responsible citizenship, effective leader take responsibilities in the fields and to participate in the process of nation building.

To meet the above requirement the course is designed to provide vast opportunities for fieldwork , training and experience. It has an inter- disciplinary approach to problem solving .It also aims at developing leadership, which can generate socio- economic development in a society through the process of professional social work. The course is an instrument for reconstruction through extension work in the field of community Health, Social Education , Agricultural Development ,Animal Husbandry , Social forestry , Agro industries etc , Persons with a motto or service maturity of mind , leadership qualities and genuine concern of the people are required for this profession.

(New Semester Pattern & Revised rules w.e.f..2008-09)

Introduction : The degree of Master of Social work is a professional Post -Graduate degree in Social work. It is a recognized qualification for positions in Governmental, Industrial and Non- Governmental sectors for positions of ICDS Supervisors CDPO, Social welfare officers, probation officers in child Development and adult correctional Organizations ,Human Resource Development in Industrial sectors, Social Development Rural and Tribal welfare and Development and empowerment , Counselors in Family Courts. Medical and Psychiatric social workers in Hospitals, social Defense, social work Research. Trained graduates after the course can get opportunities in colleges of social work The Master's degree Programme equips trainees to work as agents of change from grassroots up to policy level .

1. MSW COURSE SEMESTER PATTERN . Pattern :80:20

80 Marks : Each Theory Paper

20 Marks : Each Theory Paper, Internal Assessment on the basis of Paper Presentation/ Assignments / Term papers / Test exam / case - study presentation /Review of Article or Books / preparing bibliography/ Field based task.

Internal assessments marks shall be given by the subject teacher and shall be submitted by the Head of the Institute to the university.

2. MSW Programme Structure: Total 20 Courses/ papers, 12 Generic courses and 8 specialization courses (students shall select any one specialization) Five papers per semester. Fieldwork, Research (Dissertation) shall be compulsory and independent head of passing.

The structure of the course shall be as under:

1. Written theory papers 5 per semester, 20 papers X 100 Marks	2000 marks
2. Field work : 150 marks per semester 150X4	600 marks
3. Research Dissertation (Submitted in Semester IV)	100 marks
4. Viva Voce (Semester II and IV @ 50 marks X 2	<u>100 marks</u>

1. Eligibility: Graduates of any recognized university are eligible to apply for the MSW degree Programme

2. Medium of Instruction : The medium of Instruction shall be English. However, universality of Pune permits students to write examination answer books in Marathi.

3. Field Work : Total marks 600 (150 marks per semester)

3.1 The respective affiliated institutes/ colleges can develop the fieldwork modules according to available field of opportunities in their region. The field work over 4 semesters will include concurrent fieldwork orientation visits, rural camp, study tour and block placement.

3.2 Field work shall be of 150 marks each semester. the total field works marks of four semesters together shall 600.

3.3 Field work shall be conducted during two days a week for 15 clock hours a week.

3.4 Fieldwork shall be conducted at a social work agency recognized by the training institution. Every student shall be supervised by an experienced/ professional social worker from the agency and a faculty member from the Institute .

3.5 A Weekly individual conference of at least 30 minutes, relate to Field work of every student, shall be conducted by the field work supervisor, field work shall be evaluated internally by the assigned field work supervisor.

3.6 100 % attendance at field work is compulsory.

3.7 A student failing in field work at any semester will be considered as 'Fail' and will have to repeat the entire semester.

3.8 In any case, there is no Provision of revaluation or moderation of field work marks . at university level.

4. Viva Voce Examination: (Total marks 100 and total 50 marks each at the end of Semester II and IV)

4.1 There Shall be a Viva Voce Examination at the end of 2nd and 4th semester Based on theory knowledge, research and Field work practicum.

4.2 MSW 1st year i.e second semester Viva Voce of 50 marks will be conducted before the second semester examination by the Training Institutes on behalf of the university and marks obtained by the student shall be submitted to the University by the Head of the Institutions for inclusion on the University mark Sheet. **The minimum Marks required for passing the Viva voce are 25 at each viva voce examination .**

4.3 A student failing in Viva voce Shall be called again for the viva voce within one month of the date of declaration of the 1st year MSW Examination results, only one repeat viva voce is permissible to be conducted during the third semester, However a student failing in the second semester viva voce Examination shall be eligible for admission to the MSW Third Semester. **If student does not clear repeat viva, the student will have to repeat the entire semester.**

4.4 MSW 2nd Year i.e fourth Semester Viva Voce Examination of 50 marks shall be conducted externally by the University.

4.5 The Viva Voce conducted in the fourth Semester shall be based on theory of 2nd years, field work , research, professional development and related area of specialization.

5. RESEARCH DISSERTATION (100 marks)

5.1 Every MSW student is required to select appropriate topic for his/ her research dissertation during the second Semester and complete the dissertation and submit to the institute before **15th march of the fourth semester .**

5.2 Completion and submission of the Research Dissertation is a pre- condition for appearing at Semester IV Examination.

5.3 There shall be only one Dissertation of 100 marks during the MSW II year and it shall be submitted to the University through the Head of the institution recommended for submission after / certification and approval of the concerned Research Guide.

5.4 The research dissertation will be recommended for submission by the Faculty Guide and evaluated externally by the University Board of Examination for 100 marks.

5.5 A candidate failing in research dissertation will have to be re-write and submit the revised dissertation in the same session within a period of three months after the declaration of results.

6. Prescribed standard for Research Dissertation :

6.1 The topic of Research must be related to the area of social work.

6.2 the candidate must follow the scientific process and methods of social work research or social research.

6.3 A minimum of 60 respondents is essential for collecting field data.

6.4 Quantified data is essential. Qualitative data . if any , must be quantified procedurally.

7. Block Placement:

7.1 Every student is required to complete his/her block field work for a period of **one month after the fourth semester examination.**

7.2 The MSW result shall not be declared until a certificate of successful completion of block placement is submitted by the assigned block field work agency, duly attested by the Head of the institution and submitted to the University.

7.3 After completion of Block placement, the student must submit a report of work to the Head of the teaching institute. This report must have been duly certified by appropriate authority in the block placement agency cordiality no leave of absence will be permissible during block placement.

8.4 Rules of ATKT:

8.4.1 A Students must pass in 3 theory course in each Semester out of 5 courses to avail the benefit of ATKT for the next semester and he/ she must clear the backlog in the next semester examination.

8.4.2 A student shall be allowed to keep term of Semester -III (MSW-II), if he/ she has no backlog and clears all the heads of passing of semester-I

8.4.3 Likewise, a student shall be allowed to keep term of semester- IV (MSW-II), if he / she has no backlog and clears all the heads of passing of semester-II

8.4.4 A student failing in field work at any semester shall not get the benefit of ATKT including theory papers and will have to repeat the entire semester

8.4.5 In any case for what so ever reasons if a student does not appear or fails in any semester examination, he/ she will have to repeat the entire semester.

9.1 Admission procedure : The candidate must apply only on a prescribed form attached to the prospectus of the institution incomplete forms and those received after the prescribed date and time will not be accepted.

The selected candidate must, at the time of admission, produce all original certificates (SSC, HSC, and Graduation cast certificate Domicile certificate, Income certificate, Non- creamy layer certificate and other relevant certificates or documents) & mark -lists.

The candidate should come prepared to pay the full fees at the time of selection test and pay the full fees on admission, if selected.

Candidates will to obtain their transference certificate indicating the college last attended and examination last passed.

The candidates who have passed their last qualifying Examination from University other than Pune University must submit a migration certificate immediately after securing admission. As per University of Pune rules every candidate must obtain an eligibility form will available at the office and the dates will be announced accordingly.

Applications for eligibility certificate to be sent to the Registrar, University of pune along with the transfer, migration and passing certificates and statement of marks. Documents must be submitted in time.

A student who fails to the obtain the eligibility certificate will not be permitted to appear for the Semesters IV Examination .

9.2 Reservation of Seats :

There will be reservation of seats as per rules of University of Pune. Reservation is based on rules of the university and other competent authorities framed and implements from time to time.

10 Discipline:

Students are expected to follow all rules and maintain discipline throughout the course period. Students will be made aware of all rules and expected discipline at the beginning of the course. Ragging in any form , within or outside the campus is strictly prohibited .In case a students is found breaking the rules of discipline , the institution can ask him/ her to discontinue the course or cancel his/ her admission at any time ,during the course.

11. Grant of terms:

100 per cent attendance is expected at the orientation Programme orientation and field work Minimum 75 % attendance is expected at the class room. Leave is ordinarily not granted. In very exceptional circumstances leave with prior permission of the Head of the institution must be obtained.

The Head of the Institution reserves the right to grant terms. Every student will have to give an undertaking in relation to compliance of the rules and regulation of the training institution . The decision of the Head of the Institution shall be final and binding in all matters pertaining to discipline and professional behavior.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE**4.1 ELIGIBILITY**

I) Graduate of any Indian statutory/ Recognized University is eligible for admission to MSW Course of the University of Pune

II) Graduate from any foreign university recognized by the university of Pune is also eligible for admission to MSW.

Clarification about eligibility

I) Graduate from any discipline such as Arts, Commerce, Science, Agriculture, Pharmacy, Medicine, Architecture, Engineering etc. is Eligible for admission.

II) Both men and women graduate candidate are eligible for admission.

III) Candidates with work experience in the field of social service will be given preference.

IV) Preference will be given for admission to the deputed candidates who Qualify and fulfill the admission requirements.

4.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

A) Submission of Application:

Application for admission should be made in the prescribed form Available at the office of the college . A prospectus of the course and the Printed form of application can be obtained from the office of the college on payment of Rs. 250/- (150/- for SC-ST candidate)in cash . A Candidate desiring the prospectus & Application form to be sent by post may send D.D or I.P.O. Rs .250/- (150/- for SC-ST candidate)in Name of "Principal College of social work , Nashik" The Application form Duly filled in with detail information and supporting documents can be Submitted personally in the office of the college or it can be sent by post so As to reach the office not later than the date declared in the advertisement as The last date for receiving the application , the candidate must, very clearly, Mention their field of interest (Specialization desired) according to priority In the application form itself.

B) Application must be accompanied by :

- I) An amount of Rs. 300/- (200/- for SC-ST candidate) for the admission procedure charges. The Amount can be paid in the office of the college or D.D .in the name of "Principal , College of social work Nashik . " may be sent with the Application form . The D.D should be drawn on any Nationalized Bank and should be payable at Nashik.
- II) An attested copy of the mark sheet of final degree examination.
- III) An attested copy . of the degree certificate.
- IV) An attested copy of the S.S.C. and H.S.C. certificate from the college Last attended. In case of Pune University area. OR
- IV) Candidate who are not from the pune University will require 'Migration Certificate' from the University from which they have passed the qualifying examination.
- VI) Character Certification from the college .
- VII) An attested copy of other certificate (if any)
- VIII) Experience certificate (if any)
- IX) Certificate of extra curricular activities (if any)
- X) Letter of deputation .(if any)

Note: Admission form with incomplete information and without the Essential documents will not be considered.

c) Verification of the original documents:

All the original documents of the candidates will be verified at the Time of Personal interview. The candidates who will not produce the Original Documents for verification at the time of personal interview, will not be considered eligible for admission.

d) Selection procedure : The applicant fulfilling the eligibility criteria which have submitted all Essential documents and who have paid the APC will be subjected to the selection procedure. while selecting the candidates academic qualifications As well as personal qualities, which are essential for professional social work will be taken in to account. service Motto, Leadership and Concern for people are the requisite. Candidates will be selected After screening through the following three tests:-

I) Written Test : Written Test will be for 100 marks and for two hours duration . The nature of the test will be as follows:

The candidate who secured 40 marks in written exam will be eligible for G.D.& P.I.

II) Group Discussion:

There will be a group about 10 candidates selected randomly. A Topic for discussion will be declared in the G.D. room . The group is allowed 20 minutes to 25 minutes time to discuss the topic. There will be panel of Three judges. Subject knowledge, Oratory, Method of presentation and group Adjective nature etc. aspects are judged by the panel. Each judge will give Marks out of 15 and average of the three will be the final marks of the candidates of G.D.

II) Personal Interview:

Every candidate will be interviewed individually by a panel of 3 Experts 5 to 10 minutes time is allotted to each candidate for P.I. each Expert will assign marks out of 15. Average of the three will be the final Marks of P.I of candidate

The candidate who secured 20 marks in GD. & P.I. will be eligible for II Personal Interview.

iv) Selection List:

A Merit List of candidate will be prepared considering-

A list of the selected candidates for II Interview will be Interviewed by Principal of the college Reservation Deputation, experience etc. will be Given due consideration while selecting the candidates. The list of selected Candidates will be displayed on the Notice Board of the Programme.

E) ADMISSION:- The selected candidates will be allowed a time limit of as per notice for Completing the admission formalities. Payment of fee and submitting the Necessary original documents are the two requisites for admission Purpose. The candidate who will not complete the admission formalities Within the time limit will lose their claim for admission.

5. FEE STRUCTURE:-

All the fee charged are prescribed by the University of Pune. Total Annual fees are payable in two installments. First installment at the time of Admission and second installment is payable before 31st.December every Year .A fine may be charged for delay in payment of fees.

3. Scholarship Facilities for SC/ ST /NT/ OBC /SBC students:

scholarship and free ship facilities is given by college as per Government rule .Reimbursement of fees payable by the candidates of the above candidates by the state government is possible However, The candidates will be required to pay the amount to the college at the Time of admission .A claim will be submitted to the respective Government Authorities and the amount will be paid back to the concerned candidates after receiving the same from the Government Authority .

7.1 LIBRARY & READING ROOM

The college is having a library with sufficient stock of books recent Publication and more number of copies are always added to the Existing stock. Large number of reference books. Encyclopedias In various social sciences is a special feature of the college Library. One /Two books are issued at a time to a student for home reading . These books are to be returned within a period of 7 days. The library subscribes to good number of journals and periodicals in the social Sciences. Books and back issues of the journals are also Available for home lending. Current issues of the periodicals are not provided for home lending . Any Material issued on I card is not for home use. It must be returned on the same day other wise a penalty will be charged.
